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FOREWORD •



This 2018 Yearbook both acts as a testament to the year's achievements and provides a memory for us to carry into the future, offering us something to look back on fondly and reignite hidden memories. 2018 was the year that Prince Harry married Meghan and changed the face of the modern monarchy. More to the point, he opened the Invictus Games in Sydney. Adapted from America's Warrior Games and globalised, Prince Harry began the Invictus Games in 2014 as a way to assist injured soldiers regain their confidence and alleviate some of the stress of their experiences in war. One of our staff members, Mrs Carmel McCudden, officiated at the Games and shared with us the following story.

Last Thursday there was an athlete from the USA (his name was Michael) standing near the grandstand. A young girl, about 8 or 9 years of age, was sitting in the grandstand not far from him. She noticed that he did not have an arm. She was close enough to say this to him: "You are just like me – you don't have an arm." He heard this and walked over to meet the young girl and her family. They spoke for a while and she said to him: "I want to be just like you when I grow up."

Shortly after this, Michael was to receive a medal on the podium. After the medal ceremony, Michael invited her to join him on the podium as he wanted to give her his medal. On the podium he said: "I already have a medal from the last Invictus Games. You can have mine."

He was such an inspiration. This was one of many examples that I saw or heard about during the Invictus Games.

As a member of the Start Team we decided to give him something on behalf of Athletics NSW as we were very touched by his story. After we gave him our gift, he shared with us that the Invictus Games gave him hope and a sense of purpose in his life and that he had so much to thank the Invictus Games for. He shared that he was in a very dark place for a very long time. He was such a lovely gentleman. He was going back to America to continue his studies as he would like to be a PDHPE teacher. The spirit evident in this story permeates our community at Brigidine. In a very diverse environment, our girls learn tolerance and understanding. This is manifest through their daily interactions, their service work, their advocacy for those less fortunate and their respect for each other and the broader community.

And this does not happen simply. If we buy into the notion that children intrinsically adopt the habits of those with whom they spend time, then we can thank their families and their teachers for enabling their growth into young women who truly understand the value of right and respectful relationships.

As the year draws to a close, I would like to thank our community for the privilege of working among such strong and gentle women. Thank you to the College Board for its unwavering support, especially the Chair, Kitty Guerin, and the Deputy Chair, Brett Kimmorley, who stands down this year after extraordinary service to the College. I am so ably supported also by a staff of dedicated and professional people who ensure the future viability of the school; and am constantly humbled by their commitment to excellence at every level. Finally, I would like to acknowledge the College's Leadership Team, especially Mrs Sue Martin, who retires this year after 40 years of intelligent and visionary wisdom, who constantly reminds us to 'dream the dream' and then sets about making it happen.

For Brigidine College, 2018 was another year of growth and development across all facets of College life. This was as equally true of the work of the Board as it was for staff and students. At the Board AGM, we welcomed the Trustees of Kildare Ministries to the College and engaged in extended discussion, which allowed the members of the Board and the Trustees time to further develop their relationship with each other. This continues to be enhanced by regular meetings with chairs, principals, directors of mission and business managers, an induction day for new directors, staff attendance on the Pilgrimage to Ireland and opportunities for students to meet. The highlight of the year was the second Staff Conference which was held in Sydney. The theme of the conference was 'Awakening the Hope we share' and the first day was hosted by Brigidine with the Opening Liturgy held in the Chapel and an inspiring and challenging Opening Address given by Fr Frank Brennan SJ AO.

Towards the end of 2017, the architect firm, *fjmt*, was chosen after a thorough selection process to review the current Master Plan. The extensive process of consultation was carried out throughout 2018 and we await the final outcome of the review and a redraft of the Master Plan early in 2019, which will provide the College with a way forward in continuing to develop its physical resources in the years ahead.

No doubt you would be well aware that the issue of school funding has been very much on the agenda in the past year and no school is fully cognisant of what its funding will be into the future. While the Board understands Brigidine will lose significant funding as it transitions to the new funding model of 80/20 between Federal and State Governments, we do not know the impact of the changing way that each school's funding will be determined into the future. Instead of the old SES model, a new system of using parental tax data will be phased in from 2020. This does give the Board more time to plan for the future to ensure the very best outcomes for the students of the College.

Congratulations to the 2018 Higher School Certificate students who once again achieved at such a high level. The HSC results were a credit to the students, the staff and their families. I congratulate all staff across all Year groups for their ongoing commitment and dedication. Success in the HSC does not come about from what the students did in Year 12; it is the culmination of their 13 years of school and the devotion and care of their teachers over that time.

This year we welcomed one new director to the Board: Tony Eyres. I thank Tony and the other directors: Deputy Chair and Chair of the Finance Committee, Brett Kimmorley, Sr Margaret Daniels csb, Dr Kerry-Ann O'Sullivan, Koos Kruger, Fiona Trussell, Chair of the Risk Committee, Michelle Dixon, and Chair of the Property Committee, Brett McLennan, for their many contributions over the year.

During the year, two directors retired from the Board: Deputy Chair and Chair of the Finance Committee, Brett Kimmorley, and former Chair of the Property Committee, Koos Kruger. Both Brett and Koos have given several dedicated years of service that have been of enormous benefit to the College. Their many contributions, particularly to the development of the first Master Plan and its implementation, cannot be underestimated. Their legacy will live on well into the future and for that all of us at Brigidine are indeed very thankful.

Finally, I thank Jane Curran and the members of her Executive Team for their excellent leadership of the College over the past year. This year there were two significant changes to the team with the retirement of Sue Martin as Deputy Principal and Greg Smith as Business Manager. Sue Martin has been outstanding in her role as Deputy Principal Teaching and Learning and, at times, taking on the role as Acting Principal in the absence of the Principal. In 2019, we will welcome Elizabeth Webster to the position of Deputy Principal. Greg Smith has also been outstanding in carrying out his role as Business Manager and in his support of the work of the Board and its committees. Richard Luxford came in as the new Business Manager in April and he has settled in extremely well.

"I am hopeful that all our girls will not only be active and healthy but will also use their gifts and the blessings of a Brigidine education to make a difference in the world." The Catholic Church dedicated 2018 as the 'Year of Youth'. Pope Francis said to the young people of the world:

"Jesus is not the Lord of comfort, security and ease...trade in the sofa for a pair of walking shoes and blaze trails that open up new horizons capable of spreading joy. Take the path of God who teaches us to encounter him in the hungry, the thirsty, the naked, the sick, the troubled, the prisoner, the refugee and in our neighbours. Take the path of our God who encourages you to be thinkers, politicians and social activists."

Wellbeing is about feeling good and doing good. Faith and wellbeing dovetail at Brigidine as each supports the other in the holistic development of our young women. In 2018, we encouraged our girls to 'get up and get moving' and to make a difference to the lives of others just as the Pope encouraged us all to do.

In Wellbeing, our young women navigate a world fraught with the influence of social media and media depictions of beauty, fame and outer appearance. Our pastoral programs attempted to show the girls a balanced and 'right' perspective to empower them to be more confident in being themselves and less influenced by these competing forces. This year, we investigated student wellbeing and health through discussions around sleep, exercise and the influence of drugs. In the junior years, we discussed appropriate relationships, cyber safety, and the perils of the internet and one's social media profile. Year Coordinators and College Psychologists reinforced with the girls the need to be safe, supported and true to themselves and their own family values.

In the area of Faith, we introduced a few initiatives in an endeavour to facilitate our young women being more actively involved in the world and its problems. We enabled them to grow aware of their own gifts and to make the lives of others better through advocacy and justice. In 2018, we staged a 'Year of Youth' Ministry Day with inspirational singer and evangeliser Jesse Manibusan and his ministry team. The girls were motivated through story and song to stand up and be a part of the church in the world and to make a difference with their lives. In June, we held National Reconciliation Week and established a 'Sea of Hands' on the College Green to symbolise our desire to reconcile with the Indigenous people of Australia and to work with them to 'close the gap', and in recognition of their significant

contribution to Australia and care of our land.

Later in September we staged the inaugural Social Justice Forum at Brigidine. Students nominated the theme 'Youth and Hope' and organised guest speakers and workshops with an emphasis on helping young people who are homeless, dealing with mental health issues, and other social needs. The evening was a great success with over 60 students attending from various schools, and the Social Justice team should be rightly proud of what they achieved together with the forum.

In 2018 many girls came forward to be more involved in College liturgy, masses and Chapel gatherings. It is an encouraging sign and it demonstrates that our girls are desiring to lead others in faith and to do good works to help others.

I am grateful to the Pastoral team for their tireless work in guiding the wellbeing of all girls and their staff teams. I appreciate the support from the Religious Education staff, and in particular the Music department, in all of the liturgical events that we conducted together in 2018.

Like the Pope, I am hopeful that all our girls will not only be active and healthy but will also use their gifts and the blessings of a Brigidine education to make a difference in the world.








FAITH AND WELLBEING . ABORIGINAL RECONCILIATION WEEK



In late May, the College participated in Aboriginal Reconciliation Week by creating a 'Sea of Hands' on the College Green. All staff and girls were invited to select a coloured hand and to write a message of reconciliation to the Indigenous people of Australia. The hand was then placed on the message and spiked into the ground. The shape created by the sea of hands was the Cross of St Brigid decorated in the colours of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flags. The initiative was supported with a College Assembly on reconciliation, and discussion of Indigenous issues in all Religious Education and Studies of Religion classes that week.











The College was officially handed over to Kildare Ministries by the Brigidine Sisters on Thursday 24 May. This new body is made up of all the Brigidine Colleges in NSW, QLD, SA and Victoria, and also includes a Presentation Sisters school in Victoria and two women's facilities in Victoria, with the Brigidine Asylum Seekers Project in Victoria being incorporated into Kildare Ministries this year. The Sisters are still a major part of this new church entity which ensures that the story of St Brigid and the founder of the Brigidine Order, Daniel Delany, can continue to inspire and influence the communities that are a part of Kildare Ministries.

Brigidine Sisters, Kildare Ministries Trustees, and College staff gathered to ritually 'hand over' the College. Established by the Brigidine Sisters in 1954, the land on which Brigidine College St lves stands has always been a place of nurturing, learning and faith since its inception. Before that time, it was market gardens – a site utilised for cultivation of fruit and plants for the sustaining of human life in Sydney. Today it continues to cultivate and grow young people in the spirit of the Brigidine tradition. We prayed for the continuation of this community as a place of inspiration for young women and for the mission of Jesus in the world within this new entity.

Long before the Brigidine Sisters came here, it was land that belonged to the Garigal people of the Eora nation. This area was their country, their place. We acknowledge them each time we gather, honouring the presence of these ancestors who reside in the imagination of this land and whose irrepressible spirit flows through the College.

The ritual liturgy was a journey through the story of Brigidine College St Ives, which was linked to an Indigenous painting created by Year 10 students during their Camp on Cockatoo Island. The painting, prepared and inspired by the *Wandana* Indigenous group, tells the story of the College from the original Sisters and the early student pioneers to the present-day community.

As part of the annual Year 9 Pink Day this year, student leaders introduced an initiative called 'Cut for a Cause' that created an overwhelmingly positive response from students, with almost 50 girls getting involved. Girls nominated to have 15cm of their hair cut off to donate to Real Fringe Hair Bands, which provides women undergoing cancer treatment with fringe hairbands to be worn with caps and scarves. By deliberately engaging in activities for the benefit of others, girls witness how they can genuinely make a difference in the world. We admire them for their courage, generosity of spirit, and empathy for others.

A highlight of the Duke of Edinburgh Award (DEA) program is the annual 11-day trip to Fiji with the purpose of connecting with locals and spending time in the highlands community. During this unique experience, students also complete the Gold practice expedition and Residential Project.

In partnership with Destination Dreaming, led by Mrs Wacher, and supported by teaching and nonteaching staff and alumni, girls are offered opportunity to participate in a program that recognises individual goal setting and self-improvement through persistence and achievement. It develops the whole person – mind, body and soul – in an environment of social interaction and team work.



Spirituality Day on Friday 10 August, which explored important ideas and issues relating to faith and wellbeing. Year 11s acted as leaders, facilitating various activities and demonstrating effective leadership through the day as they built connection and rapport with younger students.

Year 7s focused on 'Being a Brigidine Girl' and were inspired to learn more of the Brigidine story from the Sisters and from the Year 11 Leaders and captains.

Year 8s examined their own self-worth through discussion of the topic 'More than my selfie'

with an emphasis on healthy self-image, their social media footprint and impact, and the need to be 'real' and honest with themselves.

Year 9s undertook a program called 'ALL-U-RE' or 'all you are', which again had a strong emphasis on self-worth and a deeper understanding of themselves compared with popular and media portrayals of beauty and femininity.

Year 10s were led by Catholic social justice organisation, Caritas, to discover the need for justice in the world and the 'see, judge, act' model for making a difference to others. This day grounded the girls in the importance of social justice teaching in the Catholic church and in the world.

In 2019 we hope to expand the day to include separate experiences for Years 11 and 12, thereby enabling the whole student community to have a day for developing spirituality, faith and wellbeing.

"The challenge to 'grow' each girl so that she can feel accomplished, enjoy personal success, and develop attributes that will serve her well for adulthood and the future, irrespective of her academic ability, was established." Many moments occur over the course of a year that give you pause to think. One that was a highlight in 2018 was the annual Presentation of Awards, not for its reflection of academic excellence but for its exemplification of the cultural shift we have been strategically working towards over the last few years.

Strategic plans are underpinned by an intention to improve, and phrases like 'Are all our students progressing well?', 'What information are we using to assess this progress?', and 'What actions should we take to address what the evidence and data reveal?' suggest that the focus is directed towards academic progress. All schools strive for excellence in learning so that is clearly important. At Brigidine, however, the strategic intent searches beyond that and focuses on growth, exploring the possibilities that enable personal growth in all its forms. It is in this more holistic context that success is gauged.

Many years ago, soon after I had arrived, I was struck by the culture of the College. The atmosphere was peaceful and welcoming, the girls approached their learning with diligence, and an authentic spirit of care and generosity was evident throughout the community. I niggled, however, that under the surface our environment might be a little insular and if so, it risked creating vulnerabilities that should best be addressed if girls were to be successful in the world beyond the confines of the school. It was this observation that prompted the shifting of our strategic planning from a shallow mentality of thinking that success was measured by, for example, the number of Band 6s achieved by Year 12, towards notions that were deeper, broader and significantly richer. Beliefs that could be achieved by each girl. The long-term goal was to tweak the culture and focus on exploring the possibilities that developed the 'strength' dimension of the Brigidine motto without compromising the 'gentleness'. Our search for an adjective that would describe a 2020 Brigidine girl led us to 'gutsy'; a girl who not only was unafraid to accept a challenge, independently formed her opinions and was prepared to call out injustice but who could also do so with confidence, calm determination and respectful consideration for others. The challenge to 'grow' each girl so that she can feel accomplished, enjoy personal success, and develop attributes that will serve her well for adulthood and the future, irrespective of her academic ability, was established.

Class composition, new courses. acceleration, curriculum compaction, learning support, pathways, taking advantage of cocurricular offerings to promote individual talent and interest, better use of data, and supporting teacher initiative were all components of developing a curriculum that was more capable of meeting individual student needs and guiding their curiosity towards a deeper, more critical view of the world. Exploring the possibilities in the structural framework was more practical and sensible than expecting teachers to create over 900 individualised learning plans across nine to ten subjects annually. Within the curriculum, the girls were encouraged to 'individualise' their own progress and focus on achievement that was incremental, gained in small steps of tangible improvement. Year Coordinators supported and reinforced this growth mindset with a program of positive thinking. The girls were encouraged to 'tailor' their learning program and given freedom to choose the courses they enjoyed and in which they had talent, unencumbered by external pressure and educational myths. All were monitored to ensure their decisions were carefully considered and reflected their future aspirations.

And so, we return to the annual Presentation of Awards where individual excellence and success in 2018 was showcased. As well as the placings in subjects, application to learning was recognised alongside achievement indicators in sport, social justice and wellbeing. Interspersed through the awards were presentations and performances that were a window to the progress of the strategic intent.

The scene was set when College Principal, Mrs Curran, positioned her speech on the issues of living in a post-truth world, where expert opinion and evidence is denounced and trashed. She emphasised that, more than ever, there was a need to restore rational argument, think critically about the issues around us and value the power of an education.

A Year 7 Honours presentation delivered in the style of a TED talk exhorted us to buy our clothes ethically and not unwittingly support the use of child slave labour in Bangladeshi textile factories by purchasing



cheap, mass-produced clothing sold by some of the world's biggest brands. Year 7? She impressed everyone. A Year 11 music ensemble, the Dixie Band, which was formed independently by the girls themselves with no guidance from teachers, played a haunting blues number to great applause. The Year 11 winners of the BrigFest film festival explored the generational characteristics of the last 100 years, but significantly considered that it would be Generation Alpha, the emerging one, which would be tasked with rectifying the mistakes and problems caused by the wilful ignorance and selfish greed of generations past. Even the Year 10 Drama students were able to satirise a controversial fruit-based diet with intelligent and comedic comment. A Year 9 student, who had competed successfully in the ASCA Speech competition, offered a thoughtful reflection that the muchmaligned ibis, colloquially known as the bin chicken, was in fact a displaced bird that had arrived in urban centres following the destruction of its native habitat and had been forced to adapt to new sources of food in order to survive. She likened this to refugees and other displaced people who were similarly maligned and labelled by those who had wrought destruction on the homelands of those people, forcing their movement to other places in order to survive. It was cleverly constructed and so thought provoking. Individual works by performing arts students who had won international competitions completed the diverse range of talent and success.

The talking point after the ceremony was the power of the messages presented independently by Years 7, 9, 10 and 11; and what a pleasure it was for the audience to be treated to such mature, thoughtful presentations. It was not planned to have such a theme, but it was clearly indicative of what is happening in the College. For me, after five years working with the cultural paradigm within the strategic intent, I saw 'gutsy' emerge in all its strength and gentleness glory, and I can tell you that it was very satisfying. The future is bright indeed.

A focus of the English department this year has been the continuation of the development of skills in grammar and comprehension, as well as fostering a passion for creative and imaginative writing. The new HSC course places emphasis on skills in all these areas. In Year 11, girls study a module called Reading to Write, which encourages students to read widely and experiment with voice, style, theme and setting. In Year 12, emphasis on writing in a variety of contexts continues in the Craft of Writing module. Frequent opportunities to experiment with writing enables students to approach the HSC course with confidence.

Years 7-9 students were recommended to use Scribo, a text analysis platform that facilitates them reflecting upon and improving their writing.

Our annual *Brigidine Writing Competition* invited girls to compose imaginative and well-crafted stories. Each Year group was provided with a trigger to assist in the formulation of their story. The trigger for Year 7 was 'seasons'. The students whose stories were highly commended were Erika Barnier, Abigail Mills, Scarlet Rowland Smith, Julia Ober and Zoe Pember. The winner was Alexandra Lawrence.

The trigger for Year 8 was 'loyalty'. The girls whose stories were highly commended were Lauren Board, Maren McHugh and Rose Wood. The winner was Sarah Cassidy. Lauren Board entered her story in the *Mosman Youth Awards* and it was selected as a finalist.

The trigger for Year 9 was 'morality'. The girls whose stories were highly commended were

Alexis Cameron, Stella Hall, Andie Hilton and Danielle Thrum. The winner was Courtney Wilkinson.

The overall winner of the competition was Teya Murray from Year 10. Teya's story was based on the concept of empathy and it is set in a nursing home. Below is an extract from her story.

I hate nursing homes – for starters, they're not home.

I hate nursing homes because most of the time the people in them have been put there by their own families, because they're no longer deserving of tolerance. Dismissed as 'old' as if that's all they are.

I hate nursing homes because our society's most vulnerable must spend the rest of their precious time on this earth in passive neglect. They must suspend their freedom and admit defeat to time.

I hate nursing homes, because I met Marta.

I found Marta, sitting alone, head cocked in feebleness watching helplessly as time taunted her.

Indifferent introductions are distant mumbles, but all I can do is study her eyes: spiteful clouds of age block glimpses of a characterful sun. Obstructed rays of charm that I can only imagine would have once warmed everyone they ever reached.

Dismal and confused, I'm devoured with emotion for a reason that is yet unknown to me.

My mouth, held captive by overwhelming emotion, barely manages to form the words, "Hi Marta". Her hanging head lifts, her gentle eyes finding mine.

Clouds fade, replaced by an aching happiness. Autumn eyes now speak to me, calling out in hope for seasons to change they beg for winter to let the last leaf fall.


Many students submitted poems to the *Dorothy Mackellar Poetry Competition* and the judges commented on their creativity and poetic acuity.

A focus of Stages Four and Five is a close study of a Shakespearean text. Year 8s attended a performance of *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. The show was entertaining and captured the essence of Shakespeare's comedy.

Year 12s were supported in their HSC studies by lectures from Sydney University instructor, Axel Kruse. Axel lectured on *Hamlet, The Great Gatsby*, Elizabeth Barrett Browning's sonnets and Romanticism. His presentation assisted the students with their revision program. Actors from Bell Shakespeare visited the College in May and they conducted a thought-provoking workshop on the set text for Module B, *Hamlet*.



The year 2018 was the centenary of the end of World War I, and the History department was very proud of Amber McCully (Year 11) who represented the College on the Premier's Anzac Memorial Scholarship tour in July. The 20 Scholarship recipients, representing schools from across NSW, visited the Western Front and toured the battlefields as part of the centenary of the Battle of Hamel commemorations.

Year 11 Ancient and Modern History courses introduced the revised syllabus that saw new topics being taught, such as Ancient History covering the ancient city of Persepolis, which is in the Fars region of southwestern Iran, and Modern History's examination of the American Civil War. Year 12 Modern History classes were the last to learn about Leni Riefenstahl, the female German filmmaker who rose to prominence for the Nazi propaganda films she directed, as the Historical Personality Study of HSC Modern History has been replaced. The topic, however, will live on in Year 10 Elective History.

Year 7 History experienced an in-school excursion, with the Museum of Ancient Cultures visiting us with their displays of ancient Roman artefacts. The girls loved trying on the Roman army uniforms. Year 9 History experienced an interactive show about the Industrial Revolution at the Powerhouse Museum.

Year 8 History engaged themselves in 'Herstory', when they completed research topics on women of the Middle Ages from various non-European civilisations. Year 10 History studied the Cold War instead of the unit on Australia in the Vietnam War period. This coincided with a number of interesting world developments involving the USA and Korea.

Congratulations to Mrs Rae who gave birth to a daughter and to Ms Carlson who had a son during their time away from Brigidine. Thank you to Ms Goncalves and Ms Morris who replaced them.

At the end of 2018 the History department will farewell Ms McKeown, and we wish her well for the future.

he Honours Program's focus for this year was 'Flexibility'. Students attending the regular tutorials were faced with concepts and problems which required them to think in new and unusual ways, consider the conflicting views of others, and collaboratively determine the number of possible, viable solutions. These exercises are a good training ground for the mental agility required to tackle all school work independently through Years 7-10, as well as to prepare for the requirements of the new HSC where, in the NSW Education Standards Authority's own words, there is "...a focus on depth and mastery of knowledge and skills and a reduction in the predictability of HSC examination questions".

Through individual discussions with Honours Coordinator, Ms O'Flynn, girls also employed flexible thinking and a range of problemsolving techniques, as they engaged in wide and varied research for their chosen individual projects. This year, research topics included the common good, racial bias in children, fast fashion, and sexism in the home and workplace.

To encourage flexible thinking, each Senior Honours student prepared and delivered critical thinking seminars for girls in the Junior and Intermediate levels. These presentations centred on an important world issue and tackled intriguing topics such as the true purpose of prison, education and the 'latte line', perception and how we are deceived, and the future of food.

Additionally, Senior Honours students fascinated the whole College community

through the 'Toilet Door Wisdom' initiative, where intriguing facts were paired with study tips and displayed in College bathrooms. The year 2018 proved to be one offering several occasions to extend and enhance the intellectual 'flexibility' of our Brigidine girls.

LANGUAGES • ACADEMIC 33



First of all, huge thanks go to the students of French and Italian for their enthusiasm, effort and contributions during classes over this year. We welcome and thank Madame Emily Ferguson, who came in Term 2 to cover the classes of Madame Konye while she was on leave.

This year included Year 7 students making Carnevale masks and French fans, participating in Commedia dell'Arte (exploring the famous mask characters from various regions), and a Theatre LOTE presentation of the history of France through songs. Exploring national cuisines, students ate antipasto, pizzas, and French and Italian breakfasts, and visited Haberfield and Leichhardt. They honed their language skills through speaking to exchange students, native speakers and HSC speaking skills examiners, with Year 9 French also going to the movies during the French Film Festival. Years 9-11 sat the French and Italian ALC tests in listening and reading skills, with many girls achieving Distinctions and High Distinctions. Other activities included going on speaking skills and study days, and attending the Alliance Française centre in Sydney CBD followed by lunch at the Little Snail restaurant in Pyrmont.

Student learning of language and culture was facilitated through a mix of technologies and methods, including Quizlet, Duolingo, Kahoot! and Languages Online e-learning applications, participating in role plays, making their own flashcards, designing 3D cities to learn places and directions, and producing their own animal books. They also created displays to decorate classrooms, featuring original pieces of writing such as family trees, 16th birthday menus, fashion parade commentaries, and posters of one's daily routine (using reflexives) in the present and past tenses, to name a few. Study through the NSW School of Languages proved popular with 11 students wishing to learn more about their own family's heritage. The College's quota is six new enrolments per course per year, so German, Spanish, Japanese, Greek, French and Italian were studied independently by the girls.

Languages staff's love of language, culture and learning ensures that girls are exposed to as many topics and themes as possible to enable them to survive in various situations overseas.

There is a new syllabus for 2019, and thus new programs were devised for next year. The Languages staff are well informed, and as members of NAFT, MLTA, ILTA and Co.As.It. they have ongoing access to professional development support from these associations.

n 2018 our goal in Learning Support was to try to offer additional support to an even broader range of girls throughout the College. This was delivered through the introduction of the MacqLit reading program as well as the peer mentoring and tutoring program coordinated by Mrs Wacher and the Senior Leaders. This meant that more students across a range of both organisational and academic needs were able to access support facilitated by senior students, affording this initiative a demonstrably genuine connection to the concept of peer support.

Some of this year's activities are highlighted below.

The Butterfly Café

The Butterfly Café continues to provide relevant occasions to develop and perfect students' culinary skills. Each week they cooked a variety of cultural dishes ranging from Pad Thai to English scones with cream and jam. The café is a wonderful space for girls to not only learn about foods from different countries but also to advance their everyday functional skills through reading recipes, cutting, chopping, baking, sautéing, washing up and working together as a team. These skills allowed the girls to host a special event to farewell our outgoing Year 12 students, their parents and the staff who have been so supportive and encouraging.

A newly introduced project was to look beyond their own lives and to aid our greater community by cooking meals for the 'Hope for the Homeless' program. We are indebted to Mrs Tobin, who planted the seed through her own involvement with the homeless in the North Shore area for many years and who shared her passion for serving them. It was a humbling experience for girls to listen to others whose stories revealed unendurable adversity. The café girls were delighted to be involved in such a worthwhile cause and give back to the community. They found great joy in cooking meals knowing they were helping others, and the College will continue to support this endeavour moving forward.

Danebank Dance Excursion

Once again, the annual dance excursion was conducted at Danebank in Hurstville. Schools come from all over Metropolitan Sydney to attend a fantastic day for students with a range of disabilities. Our 2019 Dance Captains, Jasmine Barbour and Georgia Tindall, were keen to be involved and swiftly began to plan, choreograph and teach the students a fabulous dance routine. This collaboration between the captains and the students allowed them to demonstrate their leadership skills and they are commended for this. We had an addition to the program this year, with one of our senior students, Jayde Lochtie, singing a beautiful rendition of the well-recognised song from the Titanic movie soundtrack, My Heart Will Go On. Another senior, Arabella DiBiase, exercised her own skills assisting with styling the girls' hair. As



always, it was a tremendous day of social skills development enjoyed by all.

Work Experience

Work Experience continues to be an essential part of our Senior program and we are appreciative of all those who grant opportunities for this to happen both externally and internally. The College Reception and Library staff give generously of their time to create authentic work experiences, which are then transferred into work placements within the wider community.

ne of the major aims of the Mathematics department is to teach our girls to think, not just to repeat what they have learned. To that end, we provide our students with a variety of opportunities to experience mathematics in different and interesting formats. Year 7s participate in the World of Maths, which is a unique travelling maths show that provides fun, colourful, hands-on, mathematical problem-solving activities. Year 8 classes attend an Inquisitive Minds workshop, which focuses not only on teaching students advanced problem-solving strategies but also on having them consider the best way of solving a problem, all done in a fun and challenging way.

Once again, Teya Murray (Year 10) was crowned Queen of Pi on our annual Pi Day. What an achievement to be able to recite Pi to 500 decimal places, surpassing her previous record! Students from Year 11 Extension Mathematics attended the Macquarie University Mathematical Enrichment Day, where they were exposed to fascinating and thought-provoking applications of mathematics at the university level. In Term 3, 432 students competed in the International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS) competition, recording some impressive results:

- 98 received Credit awards
- · 29 received Distinction awards and
- 2 received High Distinction awards, Abigail Mills (Year 7) and Jane Shin (Year 10).


This year, we hosted the annual Northern Sydney Mathematics Association Maths Challenge Day. Twenty-one teams comprising Years 8 and 9 students from a variety of schools within the Northern Sydney region



compete to solve testing mathematical problems. The event promotes mathematical dexterity, teamwork and communication skills; Courtney Wilkinson (Year 9) was a member of the winning team.

Our elective classes in Years 9 and 10 are showing the benefits of participating in the many solos concerts in their performance lessons and developing their creative talents in composition activities.

Outside the classroom, many girls join the Cocurricular Music program. We started the year with our exciting production of the musical *Thoroughly Modern Millie*. It was wonderful to see so many girls singing and tapping their hearts out in fabulous song and dance numbers! n 2018, the PDHPE department was able to offer girls several opportunities to be involved in a wide variety of both practical and theory experiences, which help to diversify a curriculum that is focused on the physical, social and cognitive development of our students.

Our programs are designed to provide a fun and informative way to learn about, adopt and maintain a healthy, active and productive lifestyle. This year's areas of focus included mental health, drug use, diversity, risk taking and safety, as well as a diverse range of physical activities.

Our elective courses in senior Stage 6 PDHPE and Years 9 and 10 Physical Activity and Sports Studies were delivered with as many hands-on experiences as possible, assisting the girls to apply theoretical understanding to practical settings. Senior PDHPE students completed a fully accredited First Aid qualification to complement their studies, and attended a sports science lecture under the guidance of a university professional. Year 10 PASS girls took part in a learn-to-surf course as well as receiving golf instruction from a professional. Year 9s studied training principles before developing a training program, put into practice through their assessment that was completed with a biathlon held at Freshwater Beach.

In Years 7-10 PDHPE, several additional experiences were incorporated. Years 8 and 10 were taught a challenging yet fun Jazz routine as part of their Dance unit. Year 10s participated in boxing fitness and Zumba classes as part of their Recreation unit. Year 9 girls practised their AFL skills under the instruction of Sydney Swans players. As always, the year ended with the annual Year 7 Aquatics excursion. This year we went to Palm Beach, where the girls engaged in a surfing lesson, practised their water survival techniques and gained a greater understanding of beach safety.

Throughout the year students were taught under the expert guidance of our highly motivated PDHPE staff, who set high standards, facilitating each girl's endeavours to reach her full potential.

PHILOSOPHY + ACADEMIC 39



"I have learned how to use the tools of logic and reason to analyse the ways in which humans experience the world. It is a great subject where everything I have learned I can use in all different subjects, not just in philosophy." Stella Hall (Year 9)

"Philosophy has taught me to look at everything I believed to be true, from a whole new perspective." Mia Ferguson (Year 9) This year, Brigidine's young philosophers were challenged to explore intriguing notions and enthralling concepts.

Year 9 thinkers considered the nature of human consciousness and the reality of the world around them to formulate their own informed answers to complex questions such as 'Is artificial intelligence really intelligence?' and 'How do I know if I am being manipulated?'.

We also examined the importance of freedom and whether it is ever possible to achieve this state. We flipped the usual assessment practice, with students changing places with their teachers through devising their own Philosophy assignment. This exercise encouraged girls to achieve a deep and detailed understanding of libertarianism and determinism.

Year 9s ended the year by evaluating beauty and the relationship between aesthetics and health, inviting debate around gene therapy and its ethical viability.

In Year 10, our Brigidine philosophers further extended their skills, pondering complex problems from the perspective of great thinkers such as Seneca, Montaigne and Schopenhauer. Puzzling dilemmas included:

- · How do we cope with disappointment?
- What is the purpose of love?
- What makes us really happy?

The girls delved into the realm of political philosophy and assessed how society should be governed. They intelligently appraised the validity of Churchill's view that "...democracy is the worst form of Government except for all those others" and contemplated the importance of justice and the role of the penal system.

Our young philosophers also took their own intellectual risks and selected an area of interest or intrigue to meditate on in their Research Project. This year's topics covered justice and Indigenous people, the significance of conformity, the difficulty of achieving animal rights, the role of imagination in the assessment of our reality, and the paradox of time.

Finally, 2018 saw our enthusiastic philosophers create the Brigidine Philosophy Club, which is open to anyone in Years 7-12 who enjoys challenging ideas in their everyday lives. Students select their own topics to deliberate over, and so far they have discussed such matters as the influence of religion on humanity and the consciousness of unborn babies.

Philosophy at Brigidine is certainly engaging students and encouraging them to become inquisitive, confident, independent thinkers.

Throughout the year, the Religious Education department has continued to foster within students the development of the Catholic faith and to deepen their awareness of the person of Jesus Christ. Students in Years 7-10 studied a variety of topics as diverse as the importance of prayer, social justice issues, reverence for creation, life and times of Jesus, and other world religions.

This year has seen many challenges, largely brought about through changes within the Religious Education department necessitated by staff on extended leave, maternity leave and temporary relief. Three teachers were welcomed to the Religious Education department, Ms Melani, Miss Boyd, and Mrs Marshall who is a new teacher to the College. As changes took effect, girls coped admirably with transitions that arose and displayed great strength and gentleness towards all members of the Brigidine community, both new and old.

Earlier this year, Years 11 and 12 students were fortunate to hear a presentation from Rabbi Jeffery Cohen about many aspects



of Judaism, including significant people and practices within the Jewish tradition. Another inter-faith activity which a small group of Brigidine senior students participated in was the annual Respect, Understanding and Acceptance workshop hosted by the Emanuel Synagogue at Woollahra. Both interfaith initiatives were invaluable opportunities for girls to consolidate their learning of the Studies of Religion course and broaden their understandings about the importance of tolerance and respect for other religions.

Finally, I would like to thank all the RE staff who continued to deepen the religious dimension and faith development of Brigidine girls and who constantly rose to the challenges that this year presented. I also thank students for the enthusiasm and reverence that they bring to their lessons.

With the introduction of the new Stage 6 Science syllabuses this year, our Year 11 Biology, Chemistry and Physics classes found themselves studying the first updated content in nearly 20 years. The updates have provided us with wonderful and exciting opportunities to incorporate new technology and modern teaching methods into the learning experience for every class. This new material is partly a harking back to past 'cores' of the subjects and also, thankfully, a nod to the fast-changing world of modern science which is having the most profound effect on our society ever seen.

Equipping our girls with skills to play active roles in their society, to effect change, and to recognise and resist backward-looking motions proposed by some leaders is an aim we strive to achieve at Brigidine. With research proving that girls excel just as well as boys at STEM subjects, our challenge is to provide a nurturing, reassuring and confidencebuilding environment so that Brigidine girls feel empowered to tackle these subjects. The College Dux of 2017, Sarah Stanaway, is an excellent example, having studied three science subjects for her HSC. A straw poll of our departing Year 12 girls revealed that, in one Biology class, every single girl was intending to pursue a tertiary pathway which has a science discipline at the core of their studies, with other classes having the majority of girls intending to do likewise. Such findings give the Science department confidence that our learning design and delivery approach is having the desired effect. A strong Science Club run by our senior girls (to be next led by



Real world engagement through a variety of excursions and activities is an important aspect of the Social Sciences.

How would you develop a zoo as a successful business? Is there profit to be made from such a venture, especially if it has to compete with the established reputation and spectacular scenery that the likes of Taronga Zoo Sydney boast? That was a scenario faced this year by Year 11 Business Studies students who attended a day of lectures and experiences at the Zoo.

Year 12 Geography girls examined a number of locations in their Urban Places and Ecosystems at Risk studies, finishing with a trip to Tamburlaine Organic Wines at Pokolbin in the Hunter Valley to inspect processes and supply linkages for their Economic Activity topic. Year 11s studied the Bantry Bay ecosystem to illustrate issues related to their Biosphere studies.

Geographers in Year 7 went to West Head to view landscapes from this spectacular vantage point then walked down to The Basin, where Aboriginal rock carvings proved the past



Indigenous use of this area for food supply and shelter. After a well-deserved rest at The Basin they caught the ferry across to Palm Beach and considered the liveability of this area, noting transport modes and housing styles.

Year 9s explored the expansion of urban areas around Sydney Olympic Park, as it is relevant to their Changing Places topic which examines the process of urbanisation. Coinciding with the *Sydney Royal Easter Show*, this excursion in Semester 1 provided an opportunity for girls to witness the impact of parking restrictions when there is a sudden influx of people to an area. Juxtaposed with that was Year 12 Society and Culture students visiting the Nan Tien Temple. A Buddhist complex located at Berkeley on the southern outskirts of Wollongong, it is an area of peace and tranquillity by comparison.

Legal Studies students attended Downing Centre Local Court to witness the trial process before watching Question Time at NSW Parliament House, observing how debate in "the bearpit" contributes to law-making. Year 10 Commerce students also saw the legal system and judiciary in action, visiting NSW Supreme Court, the Police and Justice Museum and NSW Parliament House.


Year 9 Commerce students faced a different set of circumstances in the annual Commerce Market Day simulation. Here they actually devised a product, researched the market for it, produced it and sold it in an attempt to make a profit. The impacts of competition and government restrictions on decision-making had to be considered and a wide variety of "small businesses" resulted. A Unicorn photo opportunity was certainly original and presented the need for risk analysis documents and safety precautions.

We farewelled much loved teachers Ms Valentine, Mr Summers and Mrs Linklater during this year, and welcomed Ms Barnes, Mr Clifton and Mrs Zorabi to the hardworking team, consolidating a strong skills base and bringing fresh and innovative ideas to our teaching practices.

TECHNOLOGICAL AND APPLIED STUDIES (TAS) • ACADEMIC



The year 2018 saw the introduction of Hospitality into Stage 6. Year 11 students were very busy under the guidance of Mr Gregory developing their skills in all areas of the industry. The Hospitality course offers girls the opportunity to not only complete a 2-unit HSC subject, but also to achieve an industry qualification during their senior studies. Students participated in 35 hours of industry work placement as well as assisting with catering College functions, including the Donors Cocktail evening in Term 2 and *thExhibition* in Term 3.

During the year, we also welcomed the installation of our state-of-the-art laser cutter in the workshop. This technology allows students across all TAS subjects and girls from other subject areas to exercise their design skills to create ideas and then produce them using the cutter. Year 10 Textiles Technology embraced the laser cutter, using it to etch and cut fabric to personalise their Semester 2 denim jacket project. The results were outstanding! Year 9 Design and Technology also used the new technology in the development of speaker boxes to house a speaker unit and for a frame and mirror project.

Year 9 Food Technology worked during Semester 1 to manufacture tasty sweet treats with the theme 'Everything Old is New Again' for their Food Product Development assessment task. Girls worked in groups to reinvent a traditional sweet into a new food product. They then marketed and presented the sweets to Year 8 students who cast votes to decide the winning food idea, all while serving them out of a food truck window. This was a wonderful assessment task inspiring so many delightful culinary inventions. Thank you to Mrs Hill and Mrs Frawley for such an innovative and fun assessment.



Congratulations to Year 12 students, Helena De Gruchy and Ivy Whiteman, who have been selected for inclusion in *Texstyle*, the annual exhibition of outstanding Major Textiles Projects developed by HSC Textiles and Design students. Ivy's project was also selected for display in *Shape*. Both girls worked extremely hard to produce imaginatively designed and beautifully presented garments featuring a variety of surface decoration techniques and very detailed supporting documentation.

When I was young, my mum used to tell me a story about one of her coworkers who had a disabled daughter. The daughter's mobility was limited, but her mother was determined that this would not stop her daughter from succeeding. So she covered the entire floor of the living room with car tyres which her daughter would have to climb over to get to or from the couch, forcing her to improve her physical strength. It was a slightly unconventional approach, but it worked – the daughter later went on to compete at the Special Olympics.

There are a lot of inspirational lessons in this story, but I think what struck me the most was the mother's creativity as well as her complete faith in her daughter against considerable odds.

I was always planning to use an inspirational story today – I probably learned that from years of listening to Mrs Curran – but I eventually picked this one because it sums up one of the most important lessons I have learned about Year 12 and about life. And that is that the method of approaching something is not so important, as long as you have the right mindset to make it happen.

When I listened to the Dux Reflection speech during my younger years I was kind of hoping the dux would have some 'magic' study tip that I could use to guarantee success. But since then we've had everything from Ella McCrindle (Class of 2016) who didn't believe in notes, to Brooke Menzies (Class of 2014) who is now infamous for sticking a photo of the most academic girl in the year onto her wall to motivate herself – in case you're wondering, I did not use that particular technique! And so I gradually realised that there is no 'correct' way to study – the only rule is to find what works for you. What matters much more is your mindset.

We hear a lot about the importance of mindset and positive attitude and self-belief, especially during Friday pastoral time, when everyone's just waiting for the bell to ring so they can go get their teriyaki chicken ... although now I wish I'd paid less attention to my lunch and more to what was being said, because mindset was something I was not that good at during Year 12.

Most of you know that I play the piano, and I've learned from experience that if I sit down at the piano feeling confident and in control, the performance will generally go smoothly. If I'm feeling nervous and unsettled, it never goes quite so well.

As a musician I spend a lot of time before a performance getting into the right headspace, but for some reason I never did the same for the HSC. Instead I went into my assessments feeling anxious and unprepared, particularly for subjects I was less confident in like Chemistry and English.

It was only midway through Year 12, when I was struggling through a difficult piano piece as well as a nasty bit of the Chemistry syllabus, that I started to make links between the two. I knew that if I didn't believe I could play Liszt's *La Campanella*, then I wouldn't be able to play it. It seemed logical then, that if I didn't believe I could understand acidic and basic salts, or write a good *Hamlet* essay, or remember the 'plus C', then I probably wouldn't.

Believing in yourself is the type of cheesy advice that I used to roll my eyes at, and I'm not trying to say that it will fix all your problems because we all know that's not true. The reality of Year 12, and of life, is that everyone fails sometimes and everyone has bad days. But it is much easier to pick yourself up and put one foot in front of the other if you believe you are capable and strong enough to make it through.

The other really important thing to have during those 'rock bottom' times is a support network. One of the most crucial things I now realise about life, is that it cannot be travelled alone. So on that note, I have a few people to thank.

First and foremost, to my wonderful family, especially Mum and and my sister Lauren for your support, tolerance and guidance. Dad would be proud of us today.

To all the teachers at Brigidine, especially my amazing Year 12 teachers – Ms Brewer, Mr

Farr, Mrs May, Ms Ramsay, Mrs Summerhayes and Ms Webb – I couldn't have done it without you.

To my Year group for being such a wonderful and supportive group of people, especially Rosie and Jess.

And lastly, to all the staff, students and families who so generously supported me and my family through difficult times – especially Mrs Curran, Mr Loughland, Mrs Martin, the office staff, Ms Reading, Ms Webb and all the other Year Coordinators – we are eternally grateful and I would not be up here on stage today without you.

Having a good support network is absolutely essential so I encourage all of you, especially Year 12 girls, to identify those you can go to for support and to ask them for help when you need it.

In a few weeks' time, I will begin a six-year Medicine degree at UNSW. The admissions process into medicine is intensely competitive, involving performance in the HSC and an external exam (conveniently held five days before trials!) as well as an interview. So, it's super exciting to be accepted, but I also feel like a nervous Year 7 student all over again. I have very little idea of what I'm walking into but, maybe I'm stereotyping, I'm a little worried that all the people from James Ruse might already be studying madly for our first exam. However, I will be using all of the advice I have given you today - to find what works for you, to develop a positive and determined mindset, and to ask for help - to take on this new challenge in my life.

I used to imagine that successful people had their lives all sorted out and never messed up or doubted themselves. Today, I have tried to share some of my fears, my failures, and what I learned from them, to show you that no one feels sure of themselves all of the time. The confident people from the Class of 2017 you see on stage now will soon be feeling just as lost and confused as Year 7, as we embark on a variety of new endeavours and face new challenges. These times of change and uncertainty are a natural part of life, and the best strategy I have found to deal with it is to put one foot in front of the other and trust that you will make it through, because everything usually has a way of turning out alright in the end.

It's been an honour and a privilege to talk to you all today. Congratulations to the amazing girls on stage, and to all of you in the audience – good luck and God bless.





Vale Mrs Ingrid Thompson 15 September 1957 – 1 January 2019

Our dear friend and colleague, Mrs Ingrid Thompson, passed away during the 2018 Christmas holidays. Ingrid was our Head of Department Religious Education, a highly successful and respected teacher both in the College and in the broader arena of education.

Ingrid began teaching at Brigidine in 1978, having just completed her teacher training at the Catholic Teachers' College in 1977. She later went on to complete her Bachelor of Education in Religious Education and her Masters of Theology with Distinction. Apart from a short time at Oakhill College and time off caring for her children, Ingrid had a long association with Brigidine, teaching RE, Studies of Religion, English, Visual Arts, Geography, Business Studies, Commerce and Italian. She was also very involved in Debating, Public Speaking and costume design for a number of College Musicals. The latter comes as no surprise. Ingrid loved nothing more than to play with clothes, decorating, re-inventing and re-purposing with colour and beauty that made each piece quintessentially an "Ingrid" design. Staff and students would then marvel at her capacity to balance beautifully on stiletto heels making her one of the most glamorous RE teachers in Sydney.

Ingrid was highly respected by the broader educational community, especially in Religious Education. She was an HSC Marker and Judge, a member of the Board of Studies, Studies of Religion Committee at one time, an Association of Independent Schools' Studies of Religion Professional Learning Advisory Committee member and a member of WATAC (Women in the Australian Church). Her work on interfaith understanding was reflected in the attendance at her funeral by members of the Islamic and Jewish faiths with whom she had developed both friendship and collegiality. All of these experiences she instilled in the girls at Brigidine, enabling a better understanding of their world, modelling how right relationships could be.

Ingrid's journey with Brigidine lasted 30 years so it was fitting that her family and friends farewelled her in the College Chapel on Monday 14 January 2019. It was with love and gratitude for the gifts she brought us that we said goodbye and she will live on in our personal memory and in the story of the College.







Earlier this year we approached our alumni to come back to the College to share their stories with the girls. We were overwhelmed by the response from our ex Brigo girls.


Term 1 saw many alumni return to the College to divulge details about their journey since leaving Brigidine.

Restoration of the Lindo Interhouse Shield 1960-1971

A rchives capture the lives, stories and values of the past and preserve them long after these memories have faded. They provide us with a sense of identity and pride as evidence to the achievements, works and history of the people and places that have shaped the way we are today. The Archives team ensures that the records which have value as authentic artefacts of administrative, corporate, cultural and intellectual activity are preserved, utilised and celebrated for the benefit of the whole Brigidine community – past, present and future.

This year, an exciting project was undertaken to restore the first sporting shield of Brigidine College St Ives. The Lindo Interhouse Shield 1960-1971 is one of the few objects in the collection that includes the first two houses, Fortiter and Suaviter. In 1959, at the petition of some students, Mother Romuald established the rudimentary beginning of the College Houses, dividing the school in two – Fortiter and Suaviter. The following year, Fortiter Captain Margaret Torrens and Suaviter Captain Denise Brady pioneered sporting teams and events throughout the school and fostered house pride and competition. In 1962, Principal Mother Lawrence Kinkead rearranged the houses into three new houses – Kildare, Fatima and Prague.

The Lindo Interhouse Shield 1960-1971 was awarded to the house achieving the highest tally each year from Friday sports sessions and

College carnivals. This Shield was donated and named after Mr Henry Lindo, who was one of the first lay staff members and who served as the College tennis coach from 1954 until 1989. Within the first two years of his employment he had made many successful representations for our then small College to participate in the Catholic Schools Tennis Competitions. He was very influential in the development of sports within the College, arranging tennis exhibitions, offering the girls advice and time, donating tennis racquets as raffle prizes, and providing innumerable trophies and shields.

The Shield was found in the garage of Marguerite Cawte (David, Class of 1975) and donated back to the College in 2015. It had suffered considerable damage due to the storage conditions and the natural degradation of the materials used in its manufacture. This damage included scratches, scuffing and minor areas of loss to the wood finish, tarnishing and accumulation of polishing compound on the plaques, loose and corroded metal fixtures, and the central torch spun freely.

In September 2018, Brigidine College St Ives Archives commissioned a conservator to restore the Lindo Interhouse Shield 1960-1971 to its former glory. The overall goal for the treatment of the Shield was to retain evidence of the age and patina but to achieve a wellmaintained appearance. In this restoration, the mounting fixtures were replaced, the torch was realigned and secured, the areas which had lost the wood finished were touched-in, cleaned and waxed to ensure the wood was evenly coloured, and the plaques were cleaned to reduce tarnish and corrosion then waxed with a microcrystalline wax to protect and give shine.

The end result is incredible, and Archives thanks Bespoke Conservation Services for their hard work and efforts in assisting to further the preservation of this object and celebrate the history of Brigidine College. The Shield will be on display at the College in 2019.

This year Brigidine hosted one of the most significant events in the Independent Girls' Schools' calendar, the Association of Heads of Independent Girls' Schools (AHIGS) Festival of Speech. On the evening of Friday 26 October and all day on Saturday 27 October, over 450 students from 25 schools gathered at the College to compete in the Festival. Brigidine had approximately 80 students involved as competitors or hosts.

The concept of the Festival was first mooted in the early 1990s by the Principal of Kincoppal-Rose Bay and its purpose was to encourage students to develop skills in the areas of public speaking, debating, analysis and rhetoric. The inaugural Festival was held in 1996 and attended by 15 schools. There are now 31 member schools of AHIGS, with 28 located in Greater Sydney and the other three in Mittagong, Armidale and Canberra. Over the years, 15 different schools have hosted the event and we volunteered this year.

The Festival opened at 4.00pm on the Friday with Junior and Senior Debating and Junior and Senior Readings. On Saturday, Debating continued, and Drama, Public Speaking, Current Affairs, Poetry and Religious and Ethical Questions were also contested throughout the day.

It was a wonderful opportunity to showcase our school but, more importantly, to reciprocate the hospitality which had been shown to us over many years. Congratulations and thanks to the many staff, girls and parents involved in making this day the success that it was.

Thoroughly Modern Millie

usical theatre has a tendency for presenting what is old as brand new once more, and nowhere has this been more evident than in Brigidine's production of Thoroughly Modern Millie. The show is firmly rooted in musical theatre with the first incarnation of the Millie story originating as a ragtime melodrama in London in the 1950s. Chrysanthemum focused on the titular ingenue character who falls victim to both a slave trade ring and the perils of love (a tough day for female protagonist Chrysanthemum Brown!). A decade later, this plot formed the basis of musical-romantic comedy film Thoroughly Modern Millie, starring Julie Andrews, Mary Tyler Moore and Carol Channing.

Although nominated for multiple Academy Awards in 1967, *Millie* was quietly demoted to the footnotes of Julie Andrews' career, overshadowed by her more celebrated roles, such as a singing nun in *The Sound of Music* and a whimsical nanny in *Mary Poppins*. It was eventually revived on Broadway as a reworked stage version of the film's story. Although the title song was carried over from the silver screen, the jazz standards that fleshed out the soundtrack were replaced by new compositions that told the story of Millie Dillmount and her experiences in New York in the 1920s.

Consistent with its varied lineage, *Thoroughly Modern Millie* is unsurprisingly a mix of styles, issues and characters. It is the classic story of a small-town girl trying to make it big in the Big Apple, and in this way Millie is a pseudofeminist of her time, committed to marrying first to advance her social standing rather than for love. However, the plot observes melodramatic









conventions with the villainous character of Mrs Meers, a failed actress who uses her questionable acting skills to masquerade as proprietor of a rundown hotel from where she traffics vulnerable, orphaned guests overseas for money. Add to this a production number set in an insurance company populated by stenographers, a brief visit to a 1920s speakeasy, and a traditional love triangle (or love square, as it turns out), and *Millie* becomes an unusual confection indeed.

As a Broadway show, *Millie* was a runaway success. In 2002 it won six Tony Awards, including Best Musical, and productions have toured both the US and the UK. It was a logical choice for Brigidine as it offers a variety of strong female roles (sometimes a rare commodity in musical theatre) and transported students to an era that we have not put on stage for many years. On behalf of the production team and cast, we trust that we reinvigorated the past and performed some both new and highly enjoyable material.

The History of Everything

Developed by the internationally recognised and awarded Belgian theatre troupe Ontroerend Goed, *The History of Everything* has been performed by professional theatre companies in Sydney, Belgium, London, and Amsterdam – and now at Brigidine College St Ives. I am beyond thrilled that we were the first school in the world to take on this immense challenge of staging literally the history of everything.

What events in our history become vital to share? We started with recent times, questioning what has happened today that is significant. To someone else it might be a milestone event such as a birth, engagement or a funeral. How did we stage this? Every other production of this play has utilised a vast number of props. Instead, we used what our actors are naturally blessed with – voice and movement.

I am so grateful to my fabulous colleagues and thank Mrs Anderson, Mr Edey, Mr Rutherford, Ms Pattalis and Mrs Greer for the parts they played in helping to create this production.

Finally, I congratulate our fabulous Year 11 players (cast and crew) who devoted so much time, energy and effort to bringing our history of everything to life.

Debating

One hundred members of the Brigidine community gathered at the College with their telescopes and binoculars pointed at the stars. Brigidine's Star Party was a great success with perfect stargazing conditions and 80 of the 100 attendees taking part in the successful record attempt.

Robotics

Hannah Emms, Alexandra Lawrence, Lulu La Ganza and Alma Clarsen represented our school in the Wahroonga Regional Finals of the FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology) Robotics Competition, hosted at Abbotsleigh. The girls had 5 weeks to design, build and code their competition robot for the 'Into Orbit' Mission Challenges. Additionally, students were expected to research problems associated with long term space missions on the human body, design an innovative solution, then present their work to a panel of judges. The girls achieved a pleasing result for their Mission Challenges, placing 13th out of a pool of 21 schools.

178 CLASS OF 2018 • TEACHER IN TANDEM SPEECH



Good afternoon Mrs Curran, parents, guests, staff and students, and a very special good afternoon to the graduating Class of 2018.

I would like to start by saying how honoured I was to be asked to be your teacher in tandem for 2018, and how terrified I was at the thought of standing up here today, speaking in front of the College about our six years at Brigidine together.

But, as many of you may not know, the parallels in our educational journey began many years before this. And if you will indulge me for a few minutes, I will tell you a short story.

It was January 1993, and a young, shy and very awkward girl sat in a hall not dissimilar

to Bowie Hall, palms clammy and stomach churning. For her this was a larger group of students than she had ever encountered at primary school. Her school uniform was big, neatly pressed and her school bag was half her size. She knew only a few people, as many of her close friends had moved to other secondary schools. She felt isolated and very nervous.

Moving forward six years to September 1998, she sat on a stage, not dissimilarly to the group of Year 12 students who sit before us today. This time she was confident, excited and ready to begin the next step in her education. Her uniform was a little shorter, her school bag a little smaller. She was proud to be graduating Year 12. You see ladies, that shy awkward Year 7 student was me, and this weekend I am attending my 20 year school reunion, the same day as you attend your Year 12 formal. So the parallels of our journey began well before our Brigidine story began six years ago.

My first impression of you as Year 7 students was watching from the lunchroom in the McMahon building as you wandered into the College and across the green with your parents to Bowie Hall to be welcomed by your Year 7 Coordinator, Mrs Summerhayes. It was like a scene from *Madeline*, as you all had matching oversized dresses in regulation length and your College hats were optical white. Mrs Summerhayes quickly reassured your parents that you were in safe hands and then it was off to explore your new environment. If you had any first day jitters you masked them beautifully with smiles and the excitement of learning new skills, such as mastering how to open your locker.

The tradition on the first full day of the College year is for all new staff to be introduced to students during the opening assembly. Once again as I sat on the stage, I had clammy palms and my stomach had butterflies. Mrs Curran introduced each of the new teachers; we stood, gave a quick wave and quickly sat back down. In the crowd of students, I could see all your bright faces smiling up towards the stage. At the end of the assembly the College song was sung. And just like you, we stood listening but not knowing the words. The song was very different to that of my previous school. I noticed the sound was sweet and angelic, in contrast to the bass tones I had come to know.

Year 7 was the year you developed strength and resilience, showed courage as you tried new

We parted ways in 2014 for 12 months as I went on maternity leave to have my son, Kace.

When I returned in Term 3 2015, you were very mature Year 9 students.

This is when I walked back into teaching Year 9 Textiles Technology. I was excited to be back teaching, but my class made sure I knew how much they had loved their previous teacher and that I had big shoes to fill. I remember that first term back being challenging, trying to gain your trust and also gauge your skill levels. I distinctly remember one student not seeing eye to eye with me, and although it took time I think that it is safe to say we finally made it.

Under the care and guidance of Mrs Kuper you began to mature into Year 9 students. This was the year that you were able to choose elective classes and many of you excelled at your nominated subjects.

Camp was challenging, both physically and mentally, as you completed your four-day experience in the Belanglo State Forrest. You hiked, canoed, mountain biked, sang songs and carried your heavy bags.

The musical was *Hairspray* and many of you wowed the audience with your amazing performances. This was also the last year that you would experience the International Food Fair at Founders Day. You fundraised for Pink Day and became closer as a Year group.

In Year 10 under the guidance of Miss Reading you began to flourish. This year was a busy one getting ready to become senior students of the College. I was fortunate enough to be the mentor teacher for 10.5.

> You undertook many activities that year, including the Community Involvement Program, fundraising for s Day, and many

activities, and developed new friendships. You were kind and inclusive towards each other, all traits of a hero.

For Year 8 you were under the care of Mrs Ryder. This was a special year in the history of the College — Brigidine's Diamond Jubilee year celebrating 60 years of educating girls. You attended Founders Day Mass at St Mary's Cathedral and the new Anita Murray Building was opened by then Governor of New South Wales, Dame Marie Bashir.

You attended camp where you continued to work on developing relationships and teamworking skills, participated in the College musical *Beauty and the Beast*, and attended Reflection Day. the Indigenous Awareness Day, and many of you travelling to Goodooga as part of the Immersion program. You camped at Cockatoo Island and cabined at Baden Powell when completing your urban challenge. I will never forget the experience of working with you in the Big Kitchen at Bondi, and how it moved a small group of you to volunteer on a regular basis during Year 10. I will also never forget how my camp group heard there was going to be a secret appearance by the band 5SOS on breakfast television news program Sunrise, and so the group was planning how to make it into the city from Pennant Hills using public transport for a 6am start. Thankfully the idea of a 4am wake-up call was discouragement enough, and of course there was no concert.



The Year 10 Parent Daughter Dinner was a lovely evening where we heard author, speaker, resilience trainer and para athlete Stacey Copas talk about determination and goal setting. The musical that year was The Sound of Music, where many of you had lead roles in the classic story. A highlight was hosting students from Malek Fadh Islamic School in Greenacre. Visiting students addressed the College assembly and were hosted for activities and a morning tea. Watching the interactions between students from both colleges, we observed your sense of inclusiveness and cultural sensitivity. You also experienced your own Spirituality Retreat in Term 4 about 'Finding your true self', where staff were moved by your affirmations. You began to wear your white shirts that term, and who could forget the long-awaited Year 10 Formal. This was one of my favourite events of the year. Obviously, I'd heard about the lead-up in detail every day for a term in mentor. From the dresses to the cars, make-up and accessories, to the all-important date. My mentor girls expressed their nervousness towards having to introduce partners to the College Executive and of course creating those 'old school' music playlists. Your transformation from school students to glamazons in an afternoon amazed me, and you partied the night away in style with your mentor teachers on the dance floor.

Year 11 was a time for change again under the guidance of Mrs Dunsmore. You began the Preliminary course of the HSC. Friendship groups shifted, and you had more responsibilities as senior students. The musical was *Xanadu* and this year you had the opportunity to work alongside Miss Mac in the 2017 version of *Animal Farm* in the Year 11 Play. You completed the Street Retreat, where you expanded your sense of community awareness for the needs of others. And showed off your alter egos at the Year 11 Harbour Cruise.

Year 12, what a ride it has been. You have endured countless assessment tasks, practical submissions of Major Projects, HSC performances, cocurricular activities and sporting commitments all while balancing your studies. You have shown compassion with your charity, Foster Care Angels, and have inspired the College community to embrace your theme 'We can be heroes', an acknowledgement of everyday people doing extraordinary things. You have exhibited this wholeheartedly with your fundraising efforts and the way you to continue to recognise students for doing things that make a difference to someone else, inspiring a tradition of acknowledgement I hope will continue well into the future.

Over your six years at the College you have been heroes to many minority groups. You have organised and fundraised for charities including the Christmas Hamper Appeal, St Vincent de Paul's Winter Appeal, Caritas, the Cancer Council, Goodooga and Foster Care Angels. You have demonstrated selflessness in responding to social justice issues, and expressed compassion attending immersions, the Marist Sony Foundation Camp, and the Duke of Edinburgh experience in Fiji. These are admirable traits. Year 12, as a whole you have impressed us with your achievements in the classroom, the sporting field and the stage. You have willingly and enthusiastically grasped leadership opportunities, both formally and informally.

A great adventure awaits you all as you go from the safety of the Brigidine College environment to one where you are far more at liberty to choose your own paths. The joys of greater freedom and responsibility await you. Year 12, you need to be strong and courageous today as you walk in the opposite direction to your Year 7 self, across the green and through the Chapel gates.

You will continue to be in our thoughts and prayers and therefore I will conclude with an Irish blessing:





"...what defined my Brigidine journey was the incredible group of young women who I was lucky enough to share it with."

My Brigidine journey, made up of hundreds of amazing experiences, thousands of meaningful conversations and just a little bit of learning, could not be aptly described on a single page. But, there are a few moments that I think have defined the journey for me.

Like many other Year 7 students, my fear that I wouldn't make any friends combined with the novelty of having so many clubs and sports on offer drove me to join everything I could. If there's one thing that characterised my Years 7 and 8 journey – and that still defines the journey that I see so many juniors travelling through today – it is involvement. It lays the groundwork for a strong web of friendships and was the beginning of my time at Brigidine.

I honestly believe that Year 9 was an incredible year — a controversial belief, I know, but hear me out. Firstly, camp provided us with the challenging situations that we needed to start connecting, both within our mentor but also throughout the whole Year group. The huntsman spider in the Portaloo, Outdoor Education Group leaders who thought they were army drill sergeants, and climbing what seemed like a vertical slope many times a day to get to various activities united us in a way that nothing else had before.

I also remember Year 9 Pink Day as a turning point in my Brigidine journey. I felt more engaged in the fundraising, compared with my involvement in Years 7 and 8 charities. Whether this was due to my growing maturity, having a mum who had suffered breast cancer, or simply the passion for service that I saw in the girls around me, I do not know. But the energy of this day, which I am reminded of on Pink Day every year, is an aspect of Brigidine that I will treasure forever.

The Vietnam immersion was undoubtedly a highlight of my Brigidine journey. We were able to work on a community project in a village where we built a new house for an elderly woman who had lost her husband and children and was living in a wooden shack with holes in the walls and roof. On our last day at the project, the woman shook hands with every single one of us, thanking us profusely in Vietnamese. The community project was an experience that will stay with me for the rest of my life. Being given the opportunity to lead our first student forum is one of my proudest achievements at Brigidine. When girls are invited to share their opinions and have their ideas acted upon, we become active participants in our own learning and school environment. When we have the agency and occasion to speak out, the benefits for us and the College are immeasurable. With the invaluable help and guidance of Mrs Wacher, the forum was a resounding success and I hope it will be a tradition that is continued for many years.

For me, Brigidine's focus on social justice is its most special attribute. By immersing girls in the value of service from Year 7, fundraising, organising, donating and giving become the norm. So, as we get ready to leave the College that we have called home for six years, I would like to thank every teacher who gave up their own time to provide these opportunities to us. Whether it was waking up early to take us to Lindfield Station to sell Legacy badges, travelling to Vietnam with us in your Christmas holidays, driving 10 hours in a minivan to Goodooga, supervising movie nights, sorting out the paperwork for the Community Involvement Program and Duke of Edinburgh's International Award, the list goes on and on. I cannot fully express how much I appreciate the opportunities for service that Brigidine provided me, and so I want to thank the teachers who made them all possible.





Marie Duffy taught Music at Brigidine College from 1976 to 1989. She instigated a fine tradition of singing with the first Madrigal Group and produced many shows, specialising in Gilbert and Sullivan. Awarded to a Music student in Year 12 who has given generously of her time and talents performing in school ensembles, assisting the Music staff and mentoring younger students.

Kildare Ministries Award for Social Justice

Awarded to a student in Year 12 who, throughout her time at the College has clearly demonstrated advocacy for the marginalised, has maintained a high level of involvement and has shown initiative in the College charity, outreach or faith programs.

Brigidine College 'Gold'


